



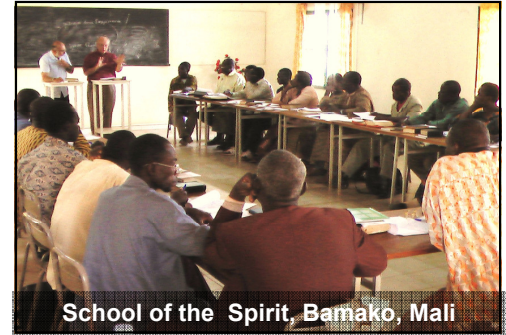

SPECIAL REPORT: West Africa Schools of the Spirit

Sixty Pentecostal revivalists from six countries recently gathered for two **Schools of the Spirit** in West Africa. They came together to strategize as to how they could be used by God to bring Pentecost to their respective countries. One school was held in Bamako, Mali (Jan. 22-26), and another in Lome, Togo (Jan. 29-Feb. 1). During each school the delegates interceded for Pentecostal revival, and each evening rallies were held where believers were baptized in the Holy Spirit. The following reports have just arrived from students attending the schools:



School of the Spirit, Bamako, Mali

Lome', Togo. Pastor Kodjo Silivi attended the recent **School of the Spirit** in Lome. He sent us the following report: "God is at work thrusting us into the work of missions to ensure that His word is well known. . . . Since attending the **School of the Spirit** we at the Assemblies of God church in BE-Apéyeme know the value of the mission of God and the power of the Holy Spirit." Following the school Pastor Silivi gathered the women of his church for a special meeting. He reports, "We invited those present to pray for the baptism of the Holy Spirit. It was wonderful! Several women were powerfully filled with the Holy Spirit."

Togo. Moussa Koumai Koudjo of Togo wrote, "Following the **School of the Spirit** in Lome' I conducted a **School of the Spirit** in my own church, with fifteen students in attendance. Later, in the town of Kara, I preached on the baptism in the Holy Spirit and fifty-nine were filled with the Spirit. Then, on February 29 one of my students from the school where I taught went to one of our church plants to conduct a prayer vigil. The theme was "The Baptism in the Holy Spirit." During the vigil all twenty-five members of this new church were filled with the Holy Spirit!"

The Spirit continues to move in other parts of Africa too!

Nigeria AG Calls for Pentecostal Outpouring



The following report appears on the official website of the Assemblies of God, Nigeria: "The Church is about to experience an unprecedented revival in the baptism in the Holy Spirit. This was the focus of the just concluded National Pastors' Conference held throughout the country. Under **Operation 75-75**, the Church is expected to monitor a spiritual growth phenomenon that will make three out of every four persons, or 75% of its membership, baptized in the Holy Spirit by the 2009, when the Church will celebrate its 75th anniversary. The Director of Corporate Planning, Rev. Uche Ama gave a detailed explanation of new plan to the leadership conference recently. The focus on the baptism of the Holy Spirit is more critical to the Church than ever, in facing the challenges of the 21st century."

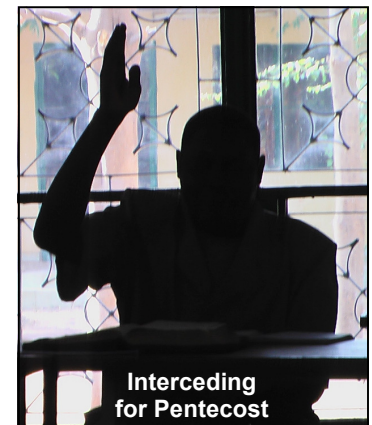
