Niger Pastors Make Bold DOP Commitments



Pastors committed themselves to God and to the Decade of Pentecost during the Niger Acts 1:8 Conference in Niamey.

In the midst of rioting, the brave pastors of the Niger Assemblies of God made bold commitments to the Decade of Pentecost.

Wide-spread Islamic rioting broke out in the city of Niamey during the final day of our recent Acts 1:8 Conference on January 13-17.

About 50 Assemblies of God pastors had gathered from across the country to intercede for the lost and to call on God to pour out His Spirit on the church. They also spent time learning and developing strategies for advancing the kingdom of God in Niger.

On the last day of the conference as the delegates were preparing for the final Decade of Pentecost Commitment Service, Islamic rioting broke out. The sessions had to be ended quickly as pastors dispersed to return to their homes and other places of safety.

As they were about to leave, Rev. Abdoul Kader Korao, General Superintendent of the Niger AG, exhorted the pastors, "We will not forget what we have learned at this conference. We will not let this stop us. We will gather our leaders

and set our Decade of Pentecost goals." The Assemblies of God in Niger was started in 1990 by missionaries from France, Burkina Faso, and the United States. Those were followed by missionaries from Ivory Coast, Nigeria, Togo, Benin, and El Salvador. The Last Tribes of Cameroon Are Receiving the Gospel


Many of the last remaining unreached people groups located in the turbulent north of Cameroon are being reached with the gospel.

According to Jim Lemons, AG missionary to Cameroon and AIA team member, "Even in the midst of radical Islamic intimidation, people are coming to Christ." In a region where 15 tribes remain unreached, the Full Gospel Mission, an Africa AG Alliance-related church, has recently opened several house churches among some of the last tribes to hear the gospel. In the past few months Cameroonians missionaries have successfully planted ten house churches in ten different villages among nine different tribes. Six of the tribes are considered unreached. Plans are being made to construct permanent facilities in five of these villages. In February 2013 the Acts in Africa Initiative conducted a Cameroon Acts 1:8 Conference in which the FGMC, lead by General Superintendent Daniel Mbiwan, committed themselves to reach the 30 unreached tribes of Cameroon.
