



## AIA Gives Update on Their “Proclaiming Pentecost” Project

The ministry reports that the sermon outline book, *Proclaiming Pentecost*, is being distributed throughout Africa and beyond.


The Acts in Africa initiative (AIA) launched their “Proclaiming Pentecost Project” in 2012. The purpose of the project was to serve the Africa Assemblies of God Alliance (AAGA) by placing a copy of the book, *Proclaiming Pentecost: 100 Sermon Outlines on the Power of the Holy Spirit*, into the hands of every Assemblies of God pastor and Bible school student in Africa.

To date, AIA has given a paperback copy of the book to 35,376 pastors in 29 countries across Africa. Distribution is complete in 26 of those countries. Possibly thousands more have downloaded the book in e-book format from the Decade of Pentecost website. (You can download your free e-book at [DecadeofPentecost.org](http://DecadeofPentecost.org).)

The book is available in seven languages including English, French, Portuguese, Spanish, Swahili (East Africa), Moore (Burkina Faso), and Amharic (Ethiopia). Other African language translations are in progress including Chichewa (Malawi), Kinyarwanda (Rwanda), and Malagasy (Madagascar).

AIA is looking to translate the book in other African languages. The ministry would like to partner with national churches who want the book in their native tongues. At present the Africa Assemblies of God reports about 80,000 ministers in 50 national churches across Africa and the Indian Ocean Basin. —Dr. Denny Miller, Director, Acts in Africa Initiative

The distribution of the *Proclaiming Pentecost* sermon outline book is part of the Africa Assemblies of God Alliance (AAGA) “Decade of Pentecost” emphasis.

The Decade of Pentecost is a ten-year missions emphasis stretching from Pentecost Sunday 2010 to Pentecost Sunday 2020. During those ten years, the fifty AAGA-related churches across Africa have committed themselves to seeing ten million new believers

baptized in the Holy Spirit and mobilized as Spirit-empowered witnesses, church-planters, and cross-cultural missionaries to the unreached peoples of Africa and beyond.

The *Proclaiming Pentecost* sermon outline serves as a valuable resource to pastors seeking to mobilized their churches for Spirit-empowered mission. The AIA office has received testimonies from pastors across Africa using the book. As a result of their preaching sermons from the book, many have been baptized in the Holy Spirit.

### Companion Book Being Developed



Acts in Africa is presently developing a companion book to the sermon outline book *Proclaiming Pentecost*. The working title for the new book is *Proclaiming Christ to the Nations: 100 Sermon Outlines of the Mission of God*.
